EU Plant Health Regime

Objective

PROTECT EU AGRICULTURE, HORTICULTURE & ENVIRONMENT FROM NEW PLANT PESTS

Challenges

- Increasing international movements of plants
 - Global trade: EU world's biggest importer of agricultural goods
 - ➤ Travellers
- Climate change (sustainability goals)

Increased vigilance for imports

Early identification and action against new pests

□ Notification of outbreaks

Horizon scanning for new and emerging pests





Legal Framework for notification of Outbreaks

- ≻ Regulation (EU) 2016/2031
- Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/2072
- Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1715 'IMSOC Regulation'



EU Regulated pests

Quarantine pests:

- Union quarantine pests
- Protected zone quarantine pests

Priority pests

EU Reference laboratories (5)

Regulated non-quarantine pests





Obligation of EU Member States to notify pests:

- ✓ Union quarantine pests
- ✓ Protected zone quarantine pests
- ✓ Pests subject to emergency measures adopted pursuant Article 30, of Regulation 2016/2031

Legal framework for notification of Outbreak

✓ EU non-regulated pests: Member State concerned considers that the pest may fulfil the conditions for inclusion in the list of Union quarantine pests





Legal framework for notification of Outbreak Regulation 2016/2031 (2)

Obligation of EU Member States to notify pests:

- \checkmark presence in its territory of a pest not known to be present there
- ✓ presence of a Union quarantine pest in a part of its territory where it was previously not present
- ✓ Measures taken, risk assessments
- ✓ Notification of the eradication of an outbreak





Legal framework for notification of Outbreaks Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1715 'IMSOC Regulation' (1)

Notification of outbreaks as required by Regulation (EU) 2016/2031, through an electronic notification system (referred to in Article 103)

'EUROPHYT Outbreaks' is the electronic notification system



Legal framework for notification of Outbreaks Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1715 'IMSOC Regulation' (2)

- ✓ Creation of EUROPHYT network
 - contact point for submitting EUROPHYT Outbreak notifications to the EUROPHYT outbreak network
- ✓ Submission of EUROPHYT Outbreak notifications to the EUROPHYT Outbreak network



Legal framework for notification of Outbreaks Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1715 'IMSOC Regulation' (3)

- ✓ Content of notifications, Annex I
 - Harmonised reporting, standard outbreak notification report
- \checkmark Timelines for submission of the information
- ✓ EU Member States indicate whether some or all of the information must be transmitted to the European and Mediterranean Plant Protection Organisation (EPPO).



Legal framework for notification of Outbreaks Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2019/1715 'IMSOC Regulation' (4)

Legal timelines for submission of outbreak notifications

- ✓ Initial notification no later than eight working days after the date of the official confirmation by the responsible official body of the presence of a pest
- ✓ Update no later than thirty days
- Follow-up update as soon as any relevant new information that has been made available or new measures have been taken
